

### 1. What is **Hypertext**?

**Hypertext** is a type of electronic document that contains pointers or links to other documents.

### 3. What is a **Bookmark**?

**Bookmark** is a link stored in a Web browser for easy reference.

### 4. What is a **Website**?

**Web site** is a collection of Web pages devoted to a single subject or organization. **Webmaster** is the person in charge of a Web site.

### 5. What is **http://** ?

The name of the protocol used to send the information between the server and your computer.

### 6. **Protocols**?

**http://** Hypertext Transfer Protocol – server is supporting the Web protocol.  
**https://** Secure Web Page – server is supporting the Web protocol, but it is secure.  
**ftp://** File Transfer Protocol – server is set up to send and receive files.  
**mailto://** Mail Server – access to e-mail server.

### 7. **Domain types**?

**Domain Type** is the last three letters of the domain name after the dot in a URL that tells you what kind of organization you are dealing with.

#### The Most Used Domain Types

<b>com:</b> Commercial companies	<b>edu:</b> Educational institutions.
<b>gov:</b> The government.	<b>mil:</b> The military.
<b>org:</b> Non-profit organizations.	<b>net:</b> Non-profit organizations.

### 8. *AutoComplete feature?*

The **AutoComplete** feature saves previous entries you've made for Web addresses, forms, and passwords.

### 9. *What is a cookie?*

A **cookie** is a piece of text that a Web server can store on a user's hard disk.

### 10. *What is an Extension?*

Extensions are small software programs that can modify and enhance the functionality of the browser.

### 11. *What is a Plugin?*

A **plugin** is a computer program that interacts with another program (for example a Web browser or an email client) to provide a certain, usually very specific, function. Adobe Reader, Flash Player, RealPlayer, Shockwave Player, Java Runtime Environment are some examples of Plugins.

### 12. *Examples*

Information system using the Internet to access hypertext documents.	<b>WWW</b>
Information stored on a user's computer by a Web site so preferences are remembered on future requests.	<b>Cookie</b>
A link stored in a Web browser for easy reference.	<b>Bookmark</b>
A computer program that interacts with another program (for example a Web browser or an email client) to provide a certain, usually very specific, function.	<b>Plugin</b>
A software that allows a user to access and view HTML documents.	<b>Web Browser</b>
An electronic connection between one Web page to other Web page.	<b>Hyperlink</b>
Text with links to other text.	<b>Hypertext</b>
A language in which web pages are written.	<b>HTML</b>
A collection of connected Web pages.	<b>Website</b>
The main page of a Web site.	<b>Home Page</b>
An address of an Internet resource.	<b>URL</b>
Where you type URLs in a Web browser.	<b>Address Bar</b>
A feature of Web browsers that predicts the URLs when user starts to type them.	<b>AutoComplete</b>
An HTML document that is accessible on the Web.	<b>Web Page</b>
